The reasons that individuals or segments of a family may want to work with the Broken Life Project could vary from mere curiosity to serious inquiries relating to medical history.

“Be prepared to find out some interesting things about your family, your past, and yourself. And be prepared to be surprised. I know I was,” Williams said.
